

Every year, class 6 have the brilliant opportunity to attend a 'Focus Week' as part of our partnership with Into University. From 10th-14th October, year 6 took part in a week of carefully planned activities to develop their knowledge of evolution (part of the science curriculum) as well as learning more about university and thinking about their own future aspirations. The week was packed full of activities including: practical science activities, research and teamwork about a particular scientist, Nottingham University workshop about adaptation and natural selection, trip to Stonebridge City Farm, writing and presenting our own future aspirations and a university campus tour. All this work was shared with parents during the final graduation ceremony held at Nottingham University.













Class 6
