Demarco wanted to know if there was a special symbol for Islam. This is the Arabic word for God




Zain asked 'How and when do Muslims pray?

David asked 'Are there any similarities between Christianity and Islam?


Adeel told us about a story that was similar to the Christmas story, which involved the angel Gabriel/Jibril in Arabic.
