As a sign of respect and to keep things clean Muslims take off their shoes before they go into the Mosque to pray





Also before Muslims pray they perform Wadu, which means they clean themselves. This can be done at home or there is an area in the mosque



Abdullah and Hamza showed us the order you have to wash yourself.



This is the minbar where the Iman takes the service from.





This is the Muslims Holy Book which is called the Quran. It is important to treat it with respect and keep it clean. It is written in Arabic, which you read from left to right



This clock shows the time and the 5 times of day when Muslims should pray. Some of the times change, through the seasons.



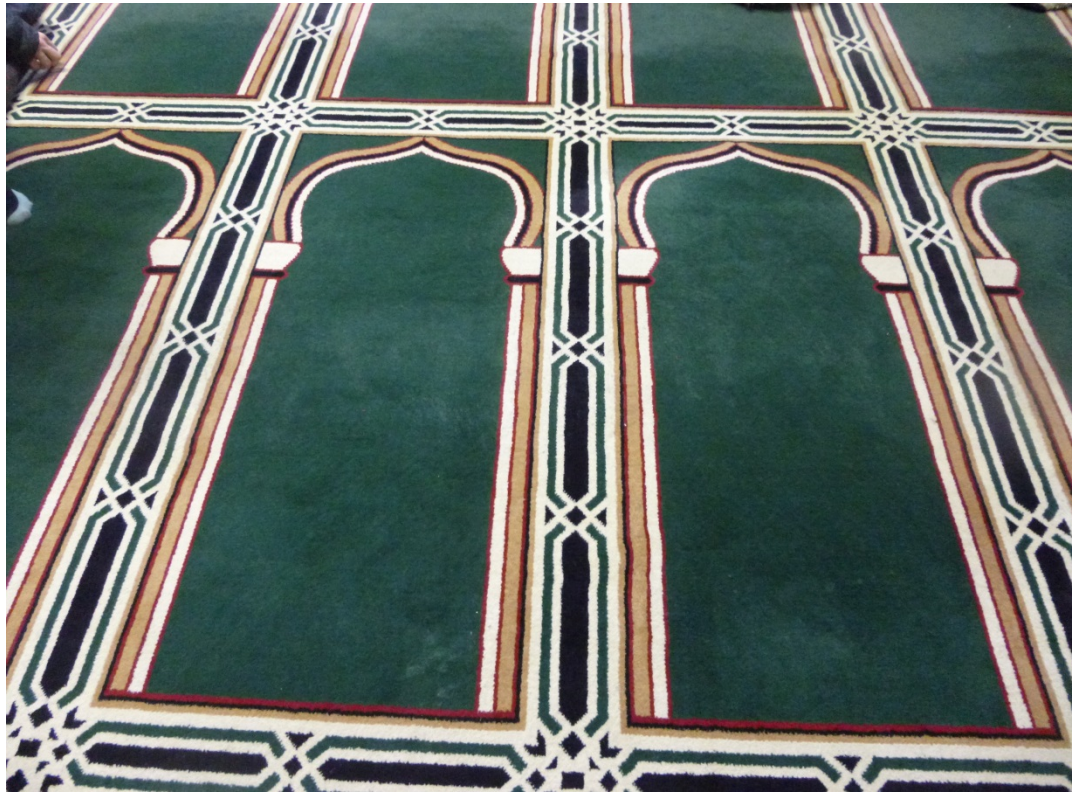
- Sunrise

- Sunset



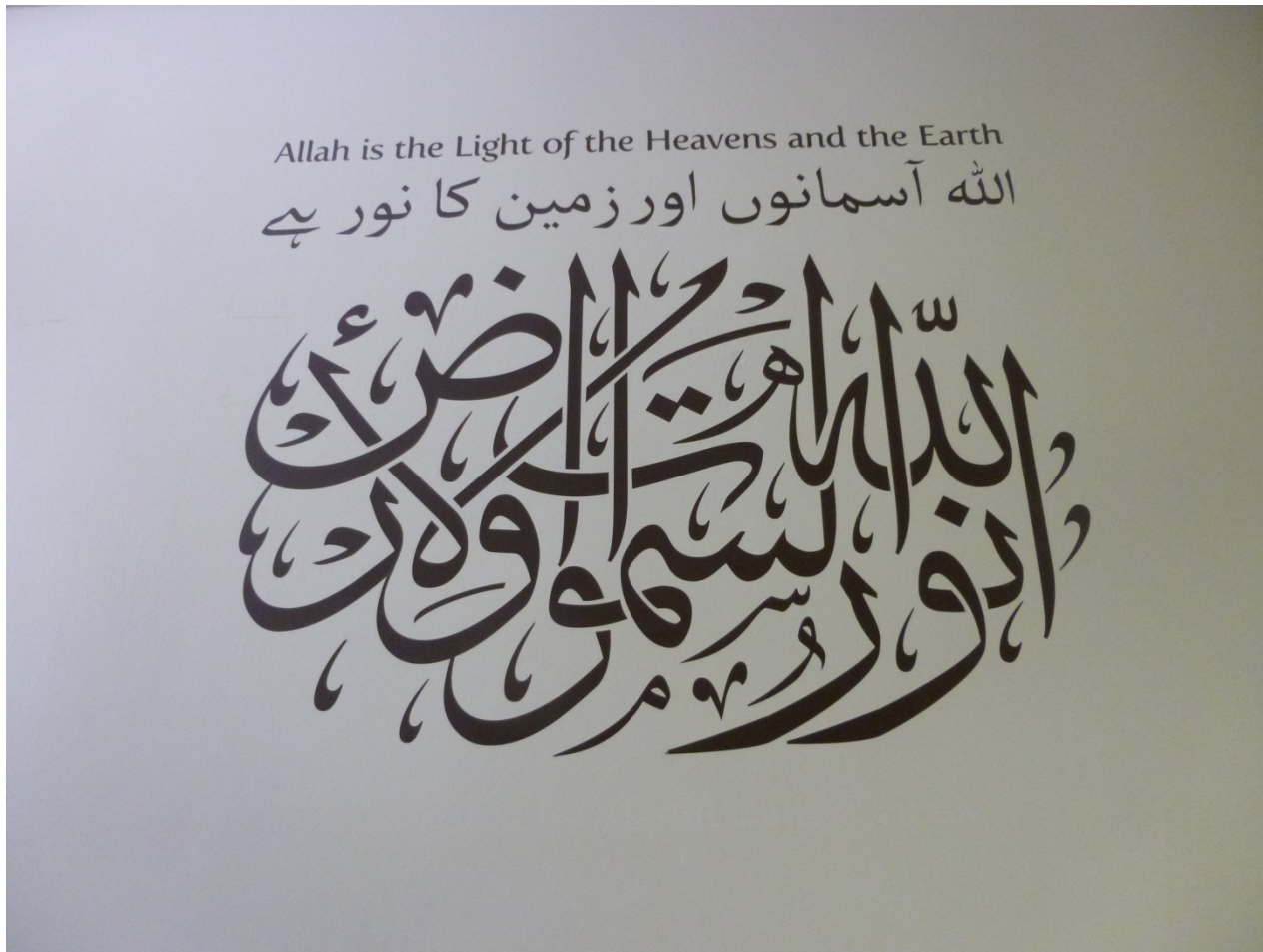
These beads are used to help people concentrate on their prayers. Women usually sit in a different place to the men.
